


Welcome to The City Palace Museum, Udaipur

The Global Pandemic, COVID-19 calls for some very simple practices to be adopted. Your safety means the most to us. While at the Museum, ensure you









The Museum is housed within a 450+ year old Palace; former abode of the Maharanas of Mewar. The Foundation stone was laid in 1559 CE by Maharana Udai Singh II, father of the renowned Rajput warrior king, Maharana Pratap. Subsequent generations contributed to the constructions.

In 1969, it was the first amongst several of the palaces in India to have been converted into a Museum; a visionary initiative by Maharana Bhagwat Singh Mewar of Udaipur. The Museum is administered by a public charitable trust called the Maharana of Mewar Charitable Foundation, and aims to provide a unique experience of the Living Heritage of Mewar.
